“We are so sad that the Queen has died. It makes you think of what she did for our Country” – Year 7


“I was so shocked. There are not many people still working at the age of 96 years old. She worked to the end showing how dedicated she was” – Year 8

“We learnt about the Commonwealth at school. She saw so many changes in the UK and beyond” – Year 9



Year 4


A quote from a child in Year 4 - "We have been thinking of the Queen and all she has done for us".

On Thursday the 8th September, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II passed away. At Church Stretton School we took the opportunity to discuss this with students during their morning tutor time. A PowerPoint was shared across the school which explained the significance of the event and offered students the opportunity to reflect on what the Queen meant to them and what the future might hold for the new King. A minute's silence was then held.



Reflecting on the life and death of Queen Elizabeth II

Our school is a community which shares the joys and successes, and, at times, the challenges and sadness, that are part of the rich tapestry of life.

Following the death of Queen Elizabeth II, we have taken time to reflect and connect with one another through this shared experience. Tutors have shown a range of media to celebrate Queen Elizabeth's long and remarkable life, discuss this momentous event and supported their "tutor family" to show their respect during our whole school "minute of silence".

We have discussed the history of our nation and changes over time in many curriculum areas and reflected on the figurehead not just as a Queen, but in the words of some of our pupils, as "the nation's grandmother". We have embraced the opportunity for some pupils to share their personal experiences, and for us to acknowledge how grief and bereavement are woven into all our lives, how we can support one another, and respect different practices at times of mourning across different cultures.

Duties, expectations and responsibilities have been amongst the themes we have explored, from those King Charles now inherits, to everyone's responsibility to be part of a successful and happy community and reinforce our "culture of kindness" and ensure "achievement for all".

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The Senior Prefect Leadership Team of Mary Webb School and Science College worked together to produce an assembly which they shared with the students in our school. These pictures are of them preparing it and delivering the assembly.



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
On Friday 9th September all students in school were part of a reflection on the life of Her Majesty followed by a 1 minute silence.
