# Creating an effective mind map

#### Good for:

- Getting the KEY points into one, concise page
- Making information manageable
- Linking information: the more links we make between information, the more our brains remember it



## Key steps:

1. Topic in the middle




- 2. Key areas within the topic
- 3. Key words, phrases and information
- 4. Make key trigger words/ key terms stand out further
- 4. Links to other knowledge

Mind maps can be done on themes...



Pictures are doodles are great for mind maps.

This is called dual-coding.

Our brains take in information via words and pictures separately.

Pairing words with pictures makes information more memorable.
